Jose



CSI is proud to conduct two important surgical trips to Mexico in 2023 to meet the enormous need that mounted during the pandemic.



At age 13 Jose's speech was unintelligible, even to his family. Jose had a complicated cleft palate — a hole in the

roof of his mouth the size of a quarter. This hole, or fistula, allowed air to flow freely between his mouth and nose, which interfered with his ability to speak. Local surgeons had attempted to close the fistula, but it presented itself again and again. The sadness and frustration Jose and his family were experiencing was gut wrenching.

Children who are fortunate enough to have access to highly specialized pediatric surgical care have this problem repaired early in life — before they start to form words. Jose grew up in a country where the poor often do not have access to this type of surgical care.

Children's Surgery International (CSI) has some of the most highly skilled surgeons in their fields as volunteers. Drs. Micheal Fritz and Daniel Sampson are two of them. They first met Jose in Hermosillo, Mexico, in 2018 and were determined to

give him the gift of speech. They made a treatment plan that would take place over the next few years during CSI's annual trips to the region.

Because of the time constraints

related to surgical missions, Drs. Fritz and Sampson needed to innovate. They didn't have the luxury of seeing Jose multiple times over the course of the year, so they planned to collaborate and perform a dual procedure on the 2019 trip.

Dr. Fritz is a pioneer of the "free flap" procedure, which uses a very thin, small flap of skin from the thigh to close the hole in the roof of the mouth. Dr. Sampson specializes in bone grafts to repair complicated cleft palates. Together they performed the surgery, creating a flap of skin to attach to the bone taken from the pelvis, providing a strong foundation to close the hole. Drs. Fritz and Sampson believe that this is the first time such a procedure has been completed on a surgical mission trip anywhere in the world.

Immediately after waking up from the surgery Jose spoke and everyone

could understand his speech! The joy and relief in the room was palpable. Jose's bravery, his family's perseverance, and the amazing talent of the CSI surgical team changed his life in a way that is indescribable.

During the pandemic while CSI teams were unable to travel, Drs. Fritz and Sampson kept in touch with Jose and his local orthodontist, who X-rayed the repair and reported that it was holding up well.

Jose is now 17, a "delightful young man," according to Dr. Sampson. This fall Dr. Sampson reinforced the graft with more bone from the pelvis. Jose's speech is entirely normal. Next year he will be eligible for cosmetic procedures to make his smile and nose more natural.

Through CSI's unique volunteer model and strong partnerships with St. Andrews Children's Clinic, Hospital CIMA and CIMA Voluntariados, Jose gained access to receive these life-changing surgeries. With normal speech and oral motor function, the sky's the limit for Jose!
