NEW POSSIBILITIES IN THE GAMBIA

We are always on the lookout for new areas in the world that may have a medical community wanting to develop a partnership with CSI. A conversation longtime volunteer Sally Lannin had with an Uber driver last year led to a possible opportunity in The Gambia, a small West African country. Through conversations with potential partners there, CSI learned that The Gambia — with a population of nearly 3 million, 55% of whom are under 25 years of age — has only one pediatric surgeon, Dr. Cherno Jallow. Dr. Jallow currently has a waiting list of hundreds of children desperately in need of craniofacial and urology surgery.

In March, CSI Medical Director Dr. Dave Tetzlaff, Sally Lannin and I were asked by the CSI Board of Directors to visit the Edward Francis Small Teaching Hospital (EFSTH) in The Gambia. Our first question was, "Where is The Gambia and how do we get there?"

During our site visit, we were able to see all parts of the hospital and meet with local health care staff. Providers at EFSTH are eager to expand their knowledge and skills. Their goal is to become

knowledgeable in pediatric surgeries and be able to meet the needs of children in their country. We also explored logistical factors that would influence the success of a surgical trip team of nearly 20 volunteers, including travel options, language, safety, local transportation, and the availability of food and hotels. To comprehensively explore our logistics options, we even flew two different air routes and stayed at two hotels, along with working with a local guide.

As we explored, we felt the need was HUGE. The Gambia is one of the poorest countries in the world, and most families struggle to meet basic human needs. However, the faces of the Gambian children and mothers carried hope in their eyes. The hope that guides CSI to our success.

The CSI board officially approved a surgical training trip to The Gambia for this fall. A group of CSI volunteers will travel in November to provide surgery to approximately 40 children, in addition to beginning education and planning that will help our partners at EFSTH realize their goals.
