Uriel's Story

You may not recognize him because he's grown so much since his first cleft surgery last November. Uriel, now 14 months and thriving, received his cleft palate repair surgery this September.

When Uriel was first evaluated by the CSI team in September 2023, his surgery had to be postponed because he was too small and malnourished due to feeding difficulties from his cleft lip and palate. By November, when CSI returned for a special cleftrhinoplasty trip, the team saw he had grown stronger and were able to work him into the surgery schedule.

Dr. Brianne Roby performed both of Uriel's surgeries, and Dr. Britta Dosland served as anesthesiologist during both procedures.

ETHIOPIA 2024

We were thrilled to send a team to Ethiopia last month after an 18-month pause due to civil unrest. CSI volunteers overcame a number of unexpected challenges with supply and equipment shortages as well as last-minute schedule and venue changes to ensure team safety. Despite these challenges, the team was able to safely travel to Bahir Dar, Ethiopia, and work side by side with long-time colleagues at Bahir Dar University and Felege Hiwot Hospital to change lives. The team provided life-changing surgical care to 48 patients, most of whom were young children. The team was also able to care for several young adults who had been waiting for surgery they should have received as children — patients like 25-year-old Sewent Muket.

Sewent is from Debre Tabor, a city in the Amhara Region of South Gondor. She is in trade school studying agriculture so she can take that knowledge back to support the family farm. Born with a cleft lip and palate, Sewet had her lip repaired in 2014 by another international surgical team and has been waiting 11 years to receive her cleft palate repair surgery. She has been able to adapt to life with a cleft palate and find a way to eat safely. Sewent has difficulty speaking and being understood and is very shy and soft spoken, reporting that most people are not able to understand her when she speaks.

Sewent and her family made the three-hour walk to the city, then rode the bus 100 kilometers to Bahir Dar in hopes that our volunteers might repair

her cleft palate. Thanks to outstanding teamwork, collaboration and efficiency, the team was able to add her to the full surgical schedule, and she received this long-awaited care. After surgery, she was full of gratitude and pride — excited for a future with more normal speech, feeding and breathing.
